

Aaron Golub, Professional Speaker, and the First Legally-Blind Division One Athlete to Play in a Game, to Headline The American Association of AdaptED Sports Programs (AAASP) ASPIRE Awards

Atlanta, August 9, 2023 – Aaron Golub, professional speaker, entrepreneur, consultant, and the first legally blind division one athlete to play in a game when he played football at Tulane University -- will headline the 5th Annual The American Association of AdaptED Sports Programs, Inc. (AAASP) ASPIRE Awards on October 22nd at Maggiano's Little Italy Buckhead. The Adapted Sports Programs in Recreation and Education (ASPIRE) Awards honors individuals and organizations who have made significant contributions central to the mission of making adapted sports programming available to children and adolescents with physical disabilities and contributing to their physical, social, and intellectual well-being.

Golub started his journey as a speaker at 17, when he was asked to go on *Good Morning America* to speak about his commitment to play football at Tulane University. He knew immediately he had a message that would impact millions, and since then he has traveled the world sharing his message. Golub will share his strategies to create true change and impactful insights with the 2023 ASPIRE nominees and winners, that will allow them to rethink their past beliefs.
