Yarbrough Wins NASO Award

RACINE, Wis. — Ernie Yarbrough, Georgia High School Association (GHSA) assistant executive director and coordinator of officiating, was chosen as the 2024 NASO Mel Narol Medallion Award recipient. The award will be presented in Atlanta on Tuesday, July 30, during the Celebrate Officiating Gala, sponsored by Fox 40 International. The Gala caps off the 2024 Sports Officiating Summit.

"I am truly humbled to receive this prestigious award," said Yarbrough. "The Lord blessed me with 30 years of running the court and another 20-plus trying to give back by creating options and growth for those who have come after me."

Beside the GHSA, Yarbrough's formal influence in the sports world has included work in the NFL, USA Softball and the American Basketball League (ABL). He worked in player development for three different NFL franchises over 13 years. For more than 50 years, Yarbrough has been involved in fastpitch softball as a player, coach and administrator. He served as the ABL's Director of Officiating from 1996-99 and has remained active in officials' observation for multiple college conferences including the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Southern Conference and the Big South Conference.

"Ernie Yarbrough has impacted tens of thousands of officials for more than four decades," said NASO President Bill Topp. "He is a consistent presence for new and veteran officials and has earned the respect of local, state and national leaders."

Prior to receiving this Mel Narol Medallion award from NASO, Yarbrough was the 1995 Naismith High School Basketball Official of the Year in Georgia and was a 2023 NFHS Citation recipient, designed to honor individuals who have made significant contributions to high school athletics and activities.

Yarbrough is a longtime NASO member and supporter. During his time with GHSA, he has been involved in historic Sports Officiating Summits held in Atlanta in 2011 and scheduled for July, 2024.

"Ernie helped lead one of the most successful State Day events when we were in Georgia in 2011," said Topp. "And he's still doing it, leading our 2024 Officiate Georgia Day efforts as we get ready to head back to Atlanta. NASO is proud of its relationship with Ernie and is eager to recognize him with the Mel Narol Medallion Award."

Yarbrough noted, "To be part of this fraternity of former Mel Narol Medallion recipients who cared enough to contribute to officiating is an honor beyond what I could have ever imagined."

Boat Operation:

• Contestants are not permitted to drive the boat when the combustion engine is in operation. Each boat will be driven by a coach or volunteer driver. Contestants may operate the trolling motor. Coaches and volunteers may provide assistance, including information about locating and catching fish, but are not permitted to fish.

Catch & Size Limit:

• Five bass per team; minimum 12 inches on all bass. License Requirement:

• A Valid GA fishing license is required for students 16 and older. Format:

• Each GHSA approved school may enter up to six boats in each regional competition. The top 15 boats from each regional advance to the state Championship. One additional boat will advance from each regional for every 10 boats that compete over a minimum of 100 boats in the regional. Boats advance from the first event in which they qualified. If a boat has already qualified for the state championship, the next eligible boat will advance.

COMMITTEE PROPOSALS:

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

- 1. **Proposal** to change pay scale for Dance Officials to be exactly the same as the current scale for Cheerleading Officials: \$10.70 per team for the first 12 teams (with pay for a minimum of 12) and \$8.60 per team for more than 12 teams. (GHSA Office)
- 2. Proposal to modify By-Law 1.62, item "c-3" on page 19 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (deleted text struck out) so as to allow students from non-member schools who transfer to GHSA schools to be eligible immediately as long as it is their first enrollment in a GHSA school: "The student has not yet established eligibility in grades 9-12 at a member school serving his area of residence. Eligibility is established at the first time the student enrolls in a GHSA member school for the first time." (Eagles Landing Christian Academy)
- 3. **Proposal** to modify By-Law 2.16, item "a" on page 24 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (new text in italic): A *GHSA member school* playing a non-region schedule may not participate in post-season competition *in the GHSA or any other association*. (GHSA office)
- 4. Proposal to modify By-Law 2.62, item "a-2" on page 28 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (deleted text struck out): (2) Participants must be in compliance with all eligibility rules of their respective associations with the exception that only those participants in grades 9-12 shall be allowed to participate. NOTE: This would allow GHSA schools to compete against non-GHSA schools that have athletes in grades lower than 9th, as long as they are eligible for high school competition in their own association. This includes GISA, GAPPS, and member schools from other State Associations who are full members. (Muscogee County Schools)
- 5. **Proposal** to add a new item "g" to By-Law 2.62 on page 29 of the GHSA Constitution as follows: All competitions in sports utilizing a Rating Formula to seed post-season qualification MUST be played to completion with a winner and loser being determined. (GHSA office)
- 6. **Proposal** to include contest officials under the GHSA Concussion Policy (by-law 2.68) should they exhibit any signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion during the officiating of a contest or scrimmage. (GHSA office)
- 7. Discussion on allowing a two-week "Arm Conditioning Period" in Baseball prior to the official date for the start of practice beginning with the 2025 season. During this two-week period, only balls, gloves and catcher's gear could be used and the four athletes to one coach skill-building sessions could not be held at the same time as the Arm Conditioning Period workouts. (North Cobb High School) For information only no vote will be taken.
- 8. **Recommendation** of the Board for the position of Executive Director to succeed Robin Hines, who is retiring.

It takes years of research and experience for manufacturers to get a handle on this.

2. FIND A SOLUTION THAT MINIMIZES SPILL AND GLARE

Glare and spill light can affect player performance and be distracting for fans. They can also impact neighbors. We've seen situations with other manufacturers' LED technology where facilities are forced to leave their lights off until they resolve issues with spill. Fortunately, there are solutions available that include optics and visoring to keep light on the field.

3. LOOK FOR A COMPLETE SYSTEM

When evaluating potential partners for your lighting project, look for a complete system from a manufacturer that provides lighting, structural, electrical components, and integrated surge protection all built to work together. Many sports lighting manufacturers only sell LED fixtures, and then build out their system with pieces and parts from different suppliers. That can make it difficult to guarantee the performance of the lighting and availability of replacement parts, and to be confident your system will be durable enough to last long after the warranty expires.

4. DON'T SKIP THE DESIGN PHASE

The best way to ensure your LED retrofit delivers the light levels you need—at minimal cost over both the short- and long-term—is with photometric lighting designs in the project's planning phase. Partners often ask if they can switch their old fixtures out for LED in a one-to-one swap, and while that approach will sometimes meet your project needs, it's situation dependent.

5. UNDERSTAND YOUR WARRANTY

No sports lighting is maintenance-free. It is important to be clear on the length and details of your system's warranty so that you know who is responsible for scheduling, performing, and paying for any necessary service. For comprehensive coverage, look for a combination of proactive system monitoring and a parts-and-labor warranty that is backed by a network of regionally based technicians who can provide timely service.
