PRESENTATIONS:

1. Presentation by Kyle Eversgard and Jackson McClure for soft-padded helmets for girls' flag football. They own a company called Gamebreaker that supplies helmets for many girls' flag football and 7 on-7 teams across the country to help prevent concussions and injuries. Helmets are like guardian caps.

2. Presentation by Ref Reps. This program is designed to recruit and retain the next generation of sporting officials. Dr. Hines endorsed the program, saying it is imperative to attract younger clientele to officiate.

3. Presentation by Kelli Hutchinson (Henry County) to promote GHSA programs to donate clothing, and funds to foster care programs in Georgia. More than 300K are in the Peach State foster care system. Georgia Athletic Directors Association and NIAAA are helping to sponsor this donation drive that expires on November 10, 2024.

DIRECTOR's REPORT

LEGAL REPORT

Justin Connell reported that they are still handling Open requests on behalf of the GHSA. He also expressed that GHSA has only one open litigation which occurred in Lowndes County, 2019. They hope to have a resolution in 2025.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Dr. Robin Hines reported that the GHSA is in good standing. Hines also encouraged the SEC to reach out and develop a relationship with their senator and representatives. Hines expects Safety from the Apalachee shooting to be a main topic coming out of legislature when they return to session. He also lists mental health awareness, N.I.L., School choice, and "Save Girls Sports" as other important topics of discussion this coming new year.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Dr. Tim Scott shared that he presented the competitive balance model with the Trustees and implored the SEC to contact him for further discussion soon. Scott also spoke of GHSA waiving membership and catastrophic insurance dues along with a member share distribution of nearly \$700,000 totaling \$1MM given back to the member schools this year. GHSA hopes to continue giving back to our member schools in coming years provided our Association continues to experience financial stability. Scott applauded the GHSA member schools' outstanding work handling Hurricane Helene's outcome, both on the playing fields and in the community while offering continued support. Lastly, Scott expressed excitement about the Football State Championships returning to the Mercedes Benz stadium later in December.

Jesse Crews motioned to adjourn; Steve Simpson seconded.
